- The aim of the Cadet Program is to develop in youth the attributes of good citizenship and leadership, promote physical fitness and stimulate the interest of youth in sea, land and air activities of the CAF.
- These youth programs have a direct impact on Canadian society as a whole, providing value in having well-rounded and experienced young citizens who are ready to assume their places as tomorrow's leaders and decision-makers.
- Although not members of the Canadian Armed Forces, the Cadet program strives to instill Canadian Military values such as:

- Respecting the dignity of all people;
- Serving Canada before self;
- Obeying and supporting lawful authority;
- Duty;
- Loyalty;
- Integrity;
- Courage;
- Stewardship; and
- \circ Excellence.
- These values are something that all Canadians can agree are important to instill in our youth.

Opportunities you can't get anywhere else

• Cadets is not a one-way street. This program gives back as much as they give to it.

- Today's cadets can choose between a wide variety of unique and challenging opportunities such as:
 - Obtaining a Tpt Canada glider or private pilot's license;
 - Participating in the Army Basic Parachute Course, and qualifying for CAF Parachute Wings, which can follow cadets into service in the Canadian Armed Forces if they so choose;
 - Sailing on Canadian Coast Guard Ships, or Royal Canadian Navy warships;
 - Participating in international cultural exchanges around the world; and
 - Participating in challenging outdoor expeditions in the far, remote reaches of Canada or even the world!
 - Cadets must dedicate their time, energy and efforts to obtain sought-after spots on these, and many more activities.
 - These opportunities are only the tip of the iceberg, as dedicated men and women across the country in each one of our Regional Cadet Support Units and at the formation Headquarters in

Ottawa continue to pursue even more activites to keep pace with today's youth.

- Indeed the delivery of this exceptional program is an enormous undertaking, and we can't do it alone. Although the mandatory programs are supported by DND there is a still a requirement for significant support:
